ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 90-12
AMENDMENT

IN RE: CERTIFICATION OF CIVIL PROCESS SERVERS


WHEREAS, since the inception of Administrative Order No. 90-12, in Re Certification of Civil Process Servers, approximately thirty-five individuals have become certified as Civil Process Servers, and,

WHEREAS, there is a desire to assure that the Civil Process Servers maintain an acceptable level of competency over time; It is therefore,

ORDERED THAT. Administrative Order 90-12, in Re Certification of Civil Process Servers, dated March 6, 1990, is hereby amended by implementing a revised Section 6 which shall read as follows:

- 6 "Upon qualification as a process server, the applicant shall be issued an identification card in the form prescribed in Section 48.29(5)(b): Florida Statutes. Any costs incident to the preparation and issuance of such card shall be paid by the applicant. Each identification card shall be renewed annually upon proof of good standing and current bond, at the cost of the applicant. In addition to the above requirements, applicants shall be retested after two years of certification to assure that they have maintained the adequate knowledge of law pertaining to servicing process. Successful completion of this test will be a requirement for recertification. The renewal process shall include retesting at each two year interval after the initial certification."
