

The position of the Chief Court Reporter shall be supervised by the Court Administrator's Office of the Second Judicial Circuit consistent with rules and policies of the Chief Judges office. Those duties will be outlined in Memorandum form to be incorporated in an Official Court Reporters' Manual and may be amended from time to time. The Chief Judge in conference with the Court Administrator shall appoint the Chief Court Reporter. The Chief Court Reporter shall receive additional compensation to be determined by the Chief Judge and the Court Administrator.

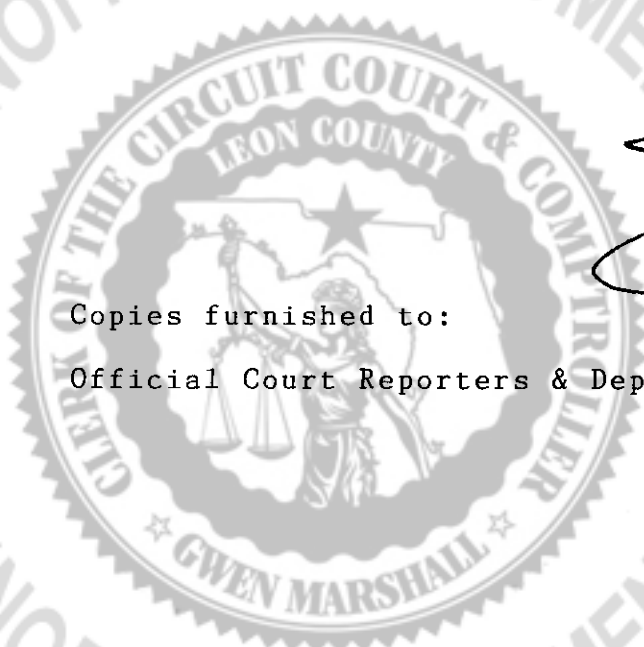
Nothing herein shall affect the normal assignments or responsibilities of the Court Reporter serving as the Chief Reporter.

This Order shall become effective October 1, 1987.
