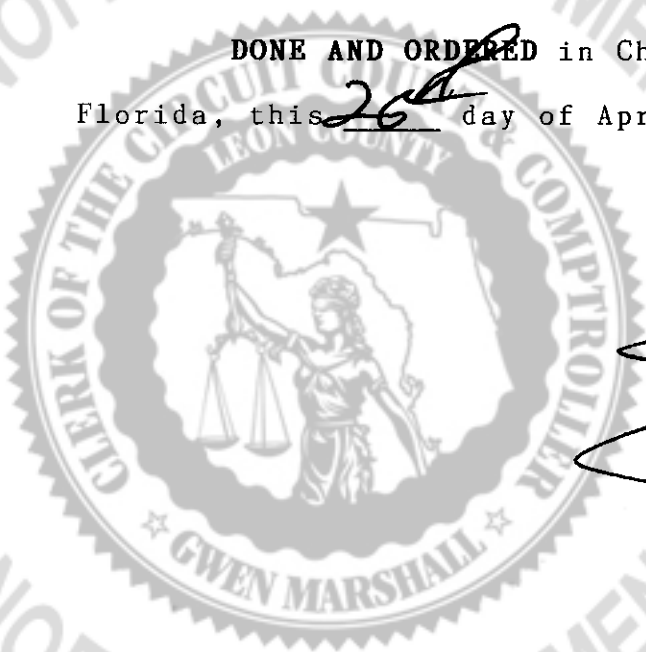

'GRANDFATHER' CERTIFICATION REQUEST

The office holders in USAM form a network of professional neutrals all of whom are practicing attorneys and members of the bar association in their respective states. The Florida affiliate, like all the other offices in the system, has a panel of mediator/arbitrators consisting of law professors, retired judges, and attorneys.

Our mediators receive a well developed training program. This program is the result of eight years of research and development in which literally hundreds of mediators across the country have been trained. It includes an intensive institute with workshop components on theory, methodology and practices of mediation in general, and United States Arbitration and Mediation in particular.

We emphasize a practicum in which a mediator trainee will work with a mediation supervisor at actual mediation sessions. A mediator will train in these sessions two or three times before becoming the principle mediator.

We submit this to you in the belief that our mediators could be "grandfathered in" during these early months as the Rules are applied, and be considered for your panel of certified mediators as they fulfill the requirements prescribed. As you know, there are guidelines from the Center of Alternative Dispute Resolution being developed that will codify the certification process and determine procedural guidelines. When your program is developed, we request that you determine at that time what requirements will be made of our mediators.

We have included a short biography on each of our mediators and a copy of an order for certification already issued in the Tenth Judicial Circuit Court of Florida.





DAVID BURSTEIN - is a retired attorney/mediator, with an extensive background in securities Arbitration. Attorney Burstein practiced law in New York before coming to Florida, and was the Chief Counsel for the William Morris Agency in New York. He is a graduate of Harvard Law School.

JAMES LEONE - a former EEO Counselor to the Securities and Exchange Commission, is a reputable attorney in the Orlando Metropolitan area. His law practice focuses on Banking Mortgage Law, Securities, Real Estate Development, Grantor Trusts, Special Business Agreements, and is admitted to practice in Florida, Illinois, D.C. and Virginia.
