and


Whereas, as a result of Federal Legislation, persons that are hearing impaired must  
be provided with an interpreter to enable them to serve as jurors when summoned to jury  
duty; it is therefore:

ORDERED that:

Administrative Order 89-111, In Re: Court Interpreters, dated September 13, 1989,  
is hereby amended by adding a new section F which shall read as follows:

"F. Fees for interpreting services for the hearing impaired may exceed the  
rate specified in Section B of this order. The Court Administrator is instructed to negotiate  
with available interpreting services to secure a rate that is favorable to each of the counties  
in the Second Judicial Circuit."
