ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO: 90-29

IN RE: RELIGIOUS HOLIDAY - YOM KIPPUR


WHEREAS, 90-926 Laws of Florida, provides that the Chief Judge of any Judicial Circuit is authorized to designate Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur as legal holidays for the Courts within the Judicial Circuit; and

WHEREAS, the scheduling of court proceedings during this religious holiday has caused inconvenience to those attorneys and employees wishing to honor this religious occasion; it is therefore

ORDERED THAT:

1. When a Court proceeding is scheduled on the date that Yom Kippur is observed, it shall be rescheduled to another date if:
  - A. The attorney of record states, in writing, that the proceeding conflicts with his/her religious convictions and would constitute a personal inconvenience; and
  - B. The attorney of record has made every effort to secure substitute counsel for that proceeding.
2. Any Judicial employee that, for religious reasons, requests leave on Yom Kippur, shall be granted 8 hours of administrative leave.
