ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 91-3
AMENDMENT

IN RE: CIRCUIT JUDGE ASSIGNMENTS SECOND JUDICIAL CIRCUIT

WHEREAS, an amendment to the above referenced administrative order was entered February 17, 1992 which specified that case reassignments to and from the newly created Family Law Division would take place on July 1, 1992; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to have overlapping assignments during the period preceding the formal effective date of July 1, 1992 in order to assure a smooth transition to the newly created division assignment system; It is therefore,

ORDERED THAT:

- I. Cases identified for reassignment to and from the Judges assigned to the new Family Law Division shall be reassigned immediately.
- II. During the period of time between the date of this amendment and July 1, 1992, judges assigned to the current circuit civil division shall be cross-assigned to enable judicial proceedings to take place as previously scheduled. Reassigned cases shall be jointly assigned to the new and previously assigned judge. The primary assignment shall be with the originally assigned judge until that judge certifies there is no more hearing time available.
- III. This cross assignment policy shall apply only to those cases identified for reassignment to or from the judges assigned to the family law division. It shall not interfere with the Chief Judges authority to reassign individual cases at his discretion.
