ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 73-2

IN RE: RULE 3.130(b)(1) FLORIDA RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE

1. Rule 3.130(b)(1) Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure provides:

"Except when he has been previously released in lawful manner, every arrested person shall be before a judicial officer within twenty-four (24) hours of his arrest. The Chief Judge of the Circuit of each county within the Circuit shall designate one or more judicial officers from the Circuit or the County Court to be available for the first appearance and proceedings."

2. Historically, County Court Judges have assumed the role of committing magistrates in the Second Judicial Circuit of the State of Florida.

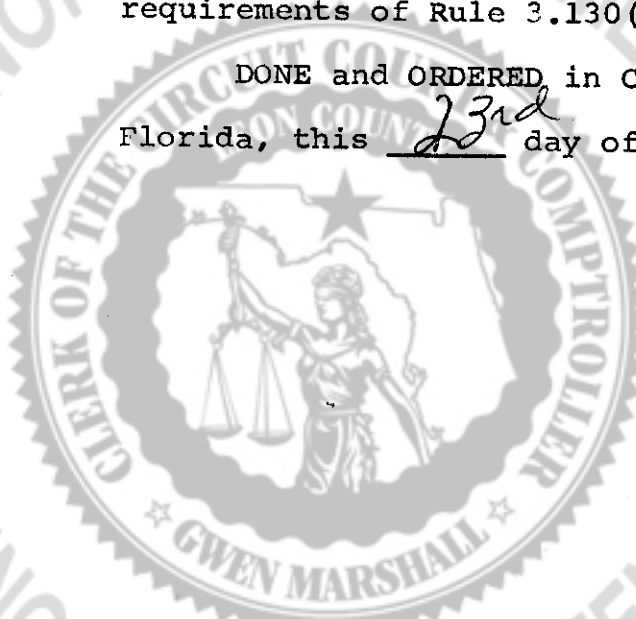
3. The legislature of Florida provided Leon with two (2) County Court Judges, Franklin County with one (1) County Court Judge, and Wakulla County with one (1) County Court Judge. Further, it is conceivable that the Judge for Wakulla County and Franklin County will be required to be subject to call each day of the week and every day of the year and that the County Court Judges of Leon County would be subject to call every other weekend, in addition to their regular duties each week.

4. In order to relieve the County Court Judges of Franklin, Leon and Wakulla Counties of seven (7) day work weeks, it is:

ORDERED that the County Court Judges of Franklin, Leon and Wakulla Counties have the full authority of committing magistrates in each of the above three (3) named counties to accomplish the requirements of Rule 3.130(b)(1), FRCP.
