ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 76-20

RE: Summons of jurors in Leon County by ordinary first class mail.

It is brought to the attention of the Chief Judge that the cost of sending summons to jurors by certified mail has risen from 73¢ per summons to 98¢. This added cost will cause an excess of expense beyond the sums budgeted for this matter. The Chief Judge is of the view that the use of ordinary first class mail with a postage cost of 13¢ per service will be adequate to procure proper venires. In view of the provisions of Section 40.23, Florida Statutes, 1975, wherein the Court may direct that jurors be summoned otherwise than by certified mail, it is hereby directed that for Leon County jurors may be summoned on and after July 22, 1976, by sending by first class mail to each person named in a venire a written notice addressed to his place of residence, with sufficient postage to carry the same.
