Civil cases, other than insurance company receiverships and
eminent domain petitions, shall be assigned by rotation to the above
judges in the following ratios: Miner 8/30; Joanos 8/30; Hartwell
7/30; Cawthon 5/30; Cooksey 1/30; Willis 1/30.

Insurance company receiverships shall be assigned to Judge
Miner. Eminent domain cases shall be assigned to Judge Hartwell as
Administrative Judge of the Civil Division for reassignment as may
be feasible. Reciprocal support act cases under Chapter 88, Florida
Statutes shall be assigned to Judge Joanos.

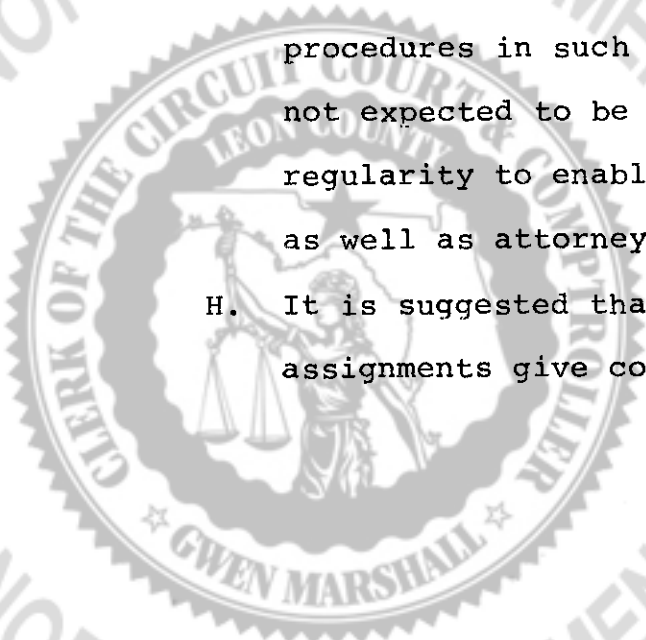

F. The administrative judges of the several sections and divisions are authorized to request the assistance of county court judges hereinafter designated in any cases or matters within the assignments of said administrative judges, and, to the extent herein set forth, the said county court judges are assigned to the circuit court for such purposes, namely:

1. County Court Judge H. Y. Reynolds of Gadsden County or his successor is assigned to the Circuit Courts of Gadsden County and Liberty County.
2. County Court Judge Hal S. McClamma of Leon County is assigned to the Probate Division of the Circuit Court of Leon County.
3. County Court Judges Eldon F. McLeod of Franklin County or his successor and Evelyn R. Flack of Wakulla County are severally assigned to the Circuit Courts of Franklin and Wakulla County.

G. Circuit Judges who are not resident in Leon County are requested to select and designate certain days for availability for hearings and other procedures in Tallahassee to facilitate scheduling and calendaring by the Leon based secretaries. Likewise, judges with other assignments in a county or counties outside their residences are requested to set regular and definite days for chambers and trial procedures in such counties. Such designations are not expected to be inflexible but with reasonable regularity to enable clerks and other officials, as well as attorneys, to make plans for such visits.

H. It is suggested that judges having civil case assignments give consideration to setting aside



certain times for ex parte hearings as provided for in Administrative Order number 74-30 with 15 minutes intervals specified and those judges with civil assignments outside of Leon County as may be feasible. This facilitates both scheduling and conserves time.
