




ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 12

RE: Boating Law

Pursuant to Chapter 78-181, Laws of Florida, 1978, effective October 1, 1978, all infraction citations resulting from a violation of Section 371.78, Florida Statutes, shall be filed by the Law Enforcement Officer issuing the citation with the Traffic Division of the Leon County Court.

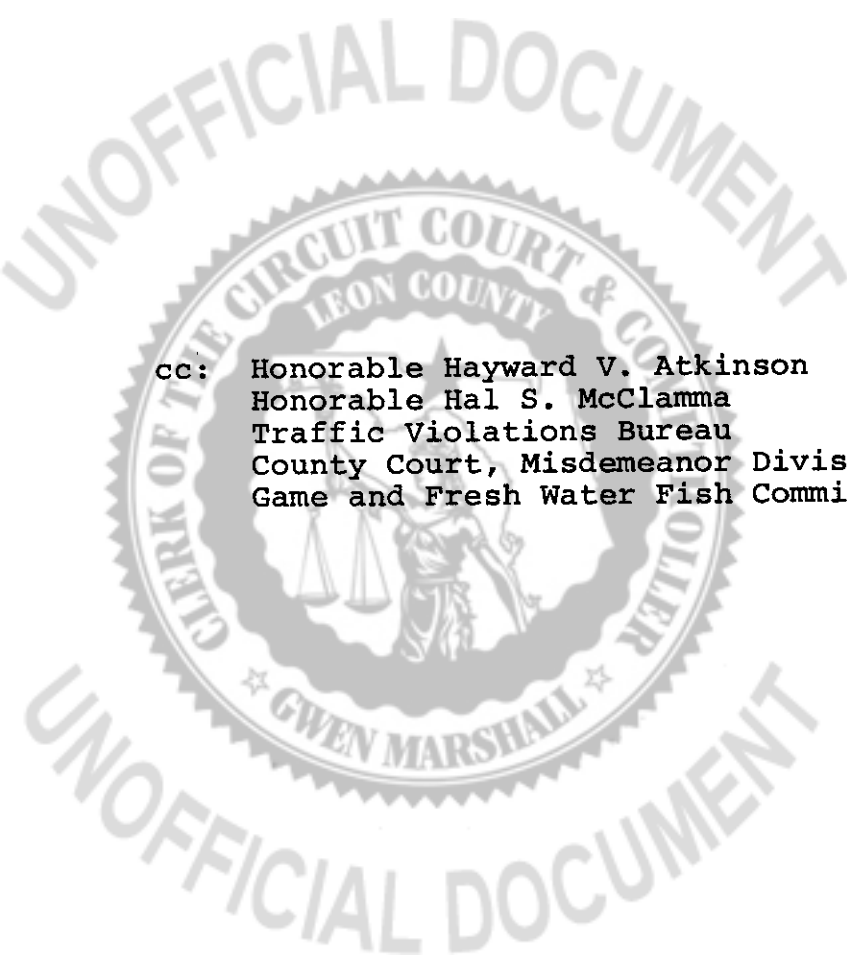
Any person receiving such a citation may pay at the Traffic Violation Bureau window a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) after the entry of a plea of guilty to said violation. Should the person receiving the citation wish to enter a plea of not guilty the case shall be set before a Judge of the Leon County Court, said violation hearing to be scheduled in accordance with other non-criminal traffic infraction hearings involving violations of Chapter 316, and 318, Florida Statutes.

treatment. The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services may conduct investigations and take samples of treated fence posts. Provides remedies and penalties for violations. Effective January 1, 1979.

Ch. 78-180 (S.B. 983) Allows inspection of truck campers and fifth wheel recreation trailers by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. Effective June 8, 1978.

Ch. 78-181 (H.B. 25) Reduces the penalty for failure to have an oar or paddle and one lifesaving device for each passenger in a motorboat under 16 feet long from a second-degree misdemeanor to a noncriminal violation. Effective October 1, 1978.

Ch. 78-182 (H.B. 187) On loans made by industrial savings banks which exceed 36 months, the discount may not exceed the equivalent of 18 percent per annum simple interest. Such banks may take second mortgages on real estate if the principal amount secured by the first and second mortgages, in the aggregate, does not exceed 75 percent of the appraised value of the encumbered real estate. Effective June 8, 1978.

Ch. 78-183 (H.B. 663) Prohibits supplying a false odometer statement. Prohibits bringing a motor vehicle into the state which has an odometer that has been illegally altered. Increases the penalty for offenses relating to odometers from a second-degree misdemeanor to a third-degree felony. Failure to supply an odometer disclosure statement, or an odometer violation under s. 319.35, is grounds for the denial, suspension, or revocation of a motor vehicle dealer's license. Requires the previous certificate number to be included in inspection records and requires such records to be maintained for 24 months. Effective October 1, 1978.

Ch. 78-184 (H.B. 718) Requires certain reports to the Governor and Legislature by the Division of Economic Security of the Department of Commerce to be made annually. Requires the annual preparation of a list of companies locating in, expanding in, moving out of, or halting operations in the state or laying off employees. Creates an Economic Development Advisory Committee, consisting of 9 members appointed by the Governor, to annually submit a plan for implementing the intent of economic development legislation. Effective June 8, 1978.

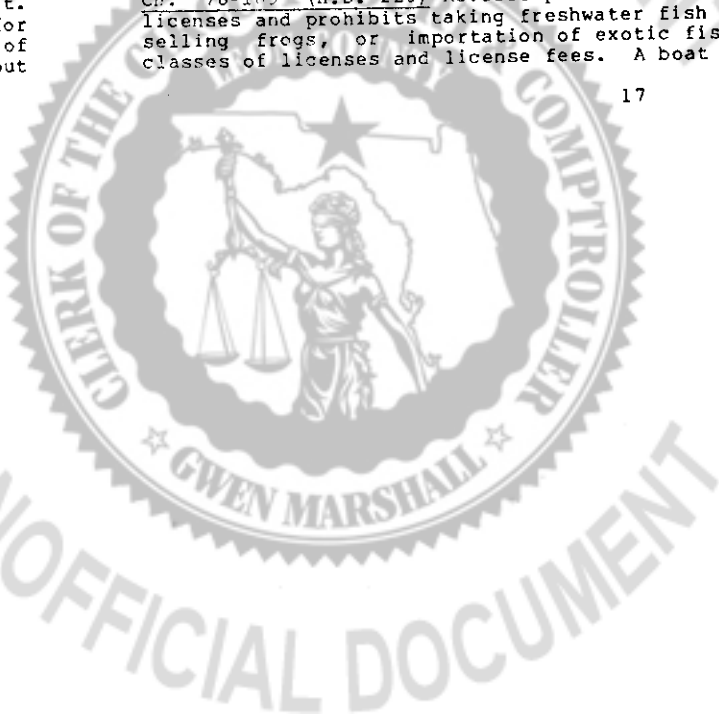
Ch. 78-185 (C.S. for H.B. 959) The official U. S. Postal Service postmark of an ad valorem tax return, exemption application, or application for special assessment filed by mail is the date of filing for purposes of ad valorem tax administration. Extends to the next working day filing deadlines which fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. Prohibits county officers from using any ad valorem tax form the substantive content of which is at variance with the form prescribed by the Department of Revenue. Effective July 1, 1978.

Ch. 78-186 (H.B. 1343) The verifying of proof of insurance needed for the issuance of motor vehicle registration shall not be construed in any court as a warranty of the reliability or accuracy of the evidence of such proof, and the tax collector is not liable for inadequacy or falsification of such proof. The issuance of a motor vehicle registration is not prima facie evidence of insurance coverage. Removes the prohibition against refunds on the unused portion of the registration period for owners of certain vehicles upon the disposition of such vehicles. A refund on a license plate for a resident owner of a vehicle which has been destroyed or permanently removed from the state will be made only if the refund is more than \$3. Effective July 1, 1978.

Ch. 78-187 (S.B. 758) Increases from one to two the number of alcoholic beverage licenses which may be obtained by an in-state manufacturer of malt beverages or wine. Effective June 11, 1978.

Ch. 78-188 (C.S. for H.B. 448) A qualification fee paid by an independent or minor party candidate must be refunded by the qualifying officer within 10 days of the determination that such candidate failed to obtain the required number of signatures. The deadline for filing petitions for independent candidates and minor parties to obtain ballot position is changed from the 92nd to the 49th day before the first primary. Provides that certain special local elections to be held the third Tuesday after the first primary may be held in conjunction with the second primary. Effective June 12, 1978.

Ch. 78-189 (H.B. 220) Revises provisions relating to freshwater fish dealers' licenses and prohibits taking freshwater fish for sale, taking for sale or selling frogs, or importation of exotic fish without a license. Establishes classes of licenses and license fees. A boat engaged in commercial fishing



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
