ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 85-6

RE: CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT

WHEREAS, the calendar of the County Court of Leon County is increasingly busy, and

WHEREAS, changes in the mandatory sentencing requirement of D.U.I. cases (Section 316.193, Florida Statutes) are requiring the trial of more cases by jury, and

WHEREAS, the Rules of Summary Claims (Rule 7.090(d)) require trials to be set not more than 60 days from the date of pre-trial conference, and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court has set as a guideline that disposition of misdemeanor cases shall occur within 90 days of arrest, and

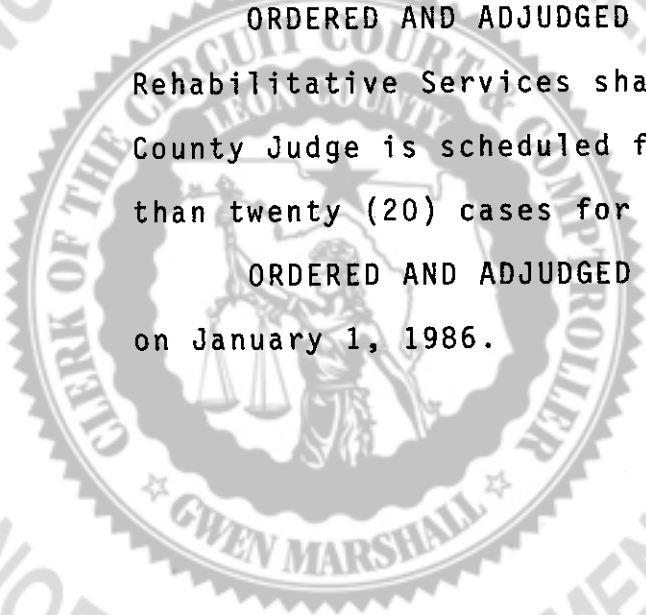
WHEREAS, all of the above are requiring a more intense scheduling of County Court time, and

WHEREAS, Child Support Enforcement for the Circuit Court can be scheduled for each Leon County Judge assigned thereto for only one-half (1/2) day after January 1, 1986, now therefore be it

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Clerk of the Circuit Court, Domestic Relations Division, shall set for hearing on each day a Leon County Judge is scheduled for child support enforcement, no more than twenty (20) cases for 10:30 A.M., and is is further


ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services shall set for hearing on each day a Leon County Judge is scheduled for child support enforcement, no more than twenty (20) cases for 9:00 A.M., and it is further

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that this Order shall become effective on January 1, 1986.
