Oxford Houses- are three-quarterway homes for individuals (either men or women - no co-ed houses) in recovery from drug/alcohol addiction which are run democratically by the residents; the residents also are responsible for paying the house rent and utilities. Entry into the houses usually requires a deposit and some advance rent. Questions about rent, deposits, medications allowed, family visitations, etc in Oxford Houses are best addressed to the house residents. All Oxford houses are owned by different and mostly local landlords so rents vary - the national average of rent residents pay is around \$550 to \$600 per month which covers all but food. All of the residents work outside the home to bring in their equal share of house expenses which are placed in the house bank account and used to pay the landlords and utilities each month (Insurance companies do not pay for stays in Oxford Houses). There is no time limit on stay provided one does not use, is not disruptive to the house, and can pay rent on time.

Oxford Houses do their own intake so applicants need to call directly to the house/houses of interest and set up an appointment with the residents. The residents will not take applicants who are actively using — the amount of clean time required is an individual house decision. The best place to start looking for an Oxford House is www.oxfordvacancies.com which has helpful information on vacancies, telephone numbers for the house and, in many cases, the cell number for a contact person. When you click on the house name on the left, there is an address, picture and a map of where that house is located in the city. To organize the cities within a state alphabetically, click on the blue "city" at the top of the grid. There is also information about Oxford Houses on www.oxfordhouse.org.
